Another good product is "Odyssey", which is produced by Redikker in the US. In general, I find that systems either do well at timetabling and internal organization (cover etc.) <u>or</u> they are good as student/parent interfaces for communications (such as Sophia), but rarely do both well.</p> <p>Another option for home-school communication is "Edline", which is web based. In general, SIMS/Nova6 is the king of timetabling – most others pale into insignificance in this area.</p>
