






At which grade levels do you have teaching assistants/instructional assistants?




What specialist teachers do you have at elementary level? (tick all that apply)

- Not as much support as we should! Looking forward to seeing what other school are doing. Thanks!
- This is for our Upper Primary School, grades 3-5: TAs are 5/10
 Classes in grades 1 and 2 and 2/10 in grades 3-5
- We also have teaching assistants working with the specialist teachers. Our EAL and LS teachers work as one: Student Support. We have one Student Support teacher assigned to each Grade level K-5 (and two St. Support TAs).
- We have a full time school psych as well as a full-time SLP.
- Early Intervention I realize this may not be what you mean but we have two teachers who provide literacy support in the host language to our host language students literacy intervention in the dominant language is in some ways like early intervention.
- The specialists indicated in the last questions are the same people who offer learning support and our counsellors are also psychologists. This year we have integrated the role of our OT specialist to work with classes on early intervention. We have a large team of English as an additional language teachers who work with our students to offer an intensive 10 hour a week programme to get students working at the required level for mainstream learning.
- Speech and Language we have a lady that runs a provide practice and we provide her a space at school. She works closely with class teachers and LS. It has been a great arrangement.
- one psychologist, shared between primary and secondary, serving 850 students. LS and EAL is staffed with one teacher and 2 assistants
- Full time counselor G1-G5; part-time counselor KG1-KG2. EAL is included in our Student Support Team services we provide EAL support, but do not name it as such explicitly; same with early intervention this support is provided by our SST. In terms of TAs, in Grades 3 through 5, we have one TA and one Student Learning Paraprofessional (SLP) for each grade level, i.e., two assistants per four classrooms.
- speech and OT are hired on a part time basis based on students' needs
- Learning Support Team consists of 2 full time teachers and 4 full time Learning Support Assistants of which are trained or experienced in special education.
- 1 Ed Psych, 1 Speech pathologist, 1 OT
- Math Coach and Lit. Coach
