While no plans are yet in place (we need to wait for the numbers to see how many students/staff are here and willing to come to campus) we are talking about a blended learning environment. Some ideas include: dividing teachers so half will do distance and half will do FtF; video recording lessons and having teachers post those for students who are not on campus; having teachers who are not here offer distance learning options. Right now, there are too many unknowns to know what our needs will be and what our capabilities will be. So we're having a lot of what-if conversations to try and understand the various scenarios and options.
